Mr Elliott, who has been involved with the Museum since childhood, brought the specimens to the Museum Laboratory where they were identified as belonging to an

Ferrodraco lentoni (Lenton's iron dragon) is the third Australian pterosaur to be named, with all three named species coming from western Queensland. The specimen was nicknamed Butch after the late Mayor of Winton, Graham 'Butch' Lenton who died several months after the discovery. The species' name lentoni was chosen in recognition of his staunch support of western Queensland's regional communities.



The first year saw 25 children and now the even averages 80-90 children enjoying (or terrified of) the evening out.

The research on *Ferrodraco* is being spearheaded by Museum palaeontologist Adele Pentland as part of her PhD in vertebrate palaeontology through Swinburne University of Technology. According to Ms Pentland, who has extensively researched Australia's pterosaurs, the skeleton of *Ferrodraco* is exceptionally well preserved and comprises five partial vertebrae, eight limb bones, a large portion of the jaw, skull and crest, and 40 isolated and partial teeth.

Pterosaur fossils are exceptionally rare in Australia and *Ferrodraco* is the first pterosaur to be named from the Winton Formation. According to Ms Pentland only 15 fragmentary pterosaur specimens had been described from the entire continent prior to the discovery. "With a total of 30 bones preserved, or 10% of *Ferrodraco's* skeleton, the number of

pterosaur bones reported from Australia has now tripled" she said.

Based on the shape and characteristics of its jaws, including crests on upper and lower jaw and spikeshaped teeth, Ms Pentland and colleagues have identified the specimen as an ornithocheirid, a group of pterosaurs that is also known from Brazil and England.

*Ferrodraco lentoni* joins several significant dinosaur specimens at the Museum including *Australovenator wintonensis*, Australia's most-complete carnivorous dinosaur, and bones from the large sauropod species *Savannasaurus elliottorum* and *Diamantinasaurus matildae*.

Co-founder of the Australian Age of Dinosaurs Museum, David Elliott OAM, describes the new discovery as one of the Museum's most exciting accessions. "The Winton area has produced the majority of Australia's large dinosaur fossils so presenting a significant pterosaur skeleton alongside the giants with which it co-existed is a huge bonus for science, education and regional tourism," he said.

The fossilised remains of *Ferrodraco* are now on display at the Museum for all to see.

### **Into the future:** First BITCOIN transaction at Balamara Bakery

Currency has long been an evolving medium since its inception 3,000 years ago from the first known official currency in Turkey created by King Alyattes of Lydia in 600BC. Known as the 'Lydian Lion' the coin featured a roaring lion - the emblem of the Lydian Kings. Made of electrum (alloy of gold and silver) the coin was the equivalent of one month's pay. From barter, to coin, to the production of notes in 1661AD, and later the plastic credit card in 1946, currency has continued to evolve with the times. Unsurprisingly, in this electronic modern era, the establishment of the first decentralised cryptocurrency was created. Derived from the word 'cryptography', a computer technology used for securing and hiding information, cryptocurrency is defined as electronic money made with technology to control how it is made, protect transactions and hide the identities of its users. In 2009 Satoshi Nakamoto created Bitcoin which then became the first widely adopted form of cryptocurrency. Bitcoin is a computer file which is stored in a 'digital wallet' app on a smartphone or computer which allows users to send Bitcoins to your digital wallet and complete transactions between yourself and other parties. Each

#### WHAT IS CRYPTOCURRENCY?

transaction is then recorded in a public list known as the 'Blockchain'. There are currently three main ways to get Bitcoins: buy Bitcoins using real money; sell things and let people pay bitcoins into your digital wallet or; they can be 'mined' using a computer. Local Balamara Bakery owner, Peter 'Ponson' Johnston, first delved into the world of cryptocurrency just over a year ago when he downloaded the app from Brisbane-based company TravelbyBit and recently completed his first bitcoin transaction when a customer saw that he was able to use bitcoin at the bakery in Winton

"A man from Mareeba came into the bakery and saw the Bitcoin sign and bought two coffee's and a custard tart with Bitcoin. This is the first of its kind in Winton, maybe the Central West, if not this side of the range. It's a step into the future for us I think."

"Bitcoin has been around for ten years and even though it has taken a bit of time for people to come around to it I believe that we will all be on Bitcoin at some stage in the future, that dollars will be gone," says Ponson. "In regional Australia there is

virtually no-one doing it but this is the first of its kind in Winton, maybe the Central West, if not this side of the range. It's a step into the future for us I think," says Ponson.

In an effort to encourage more Bitcoin transactions and conversations Ponson will start a promotion next week starting Monday 21 through to Saturday 26. Customers can ask for a bitcoin coffee and receive \$1 off and go into the draw to win bitcoins. There will be 1 draw for \$50 of bitcoin, 4 draws for \$20. The promotion will last one week and be drawn Monday 28 at 10am.



#### WHAT IS BITCOIN?

Bitcoin was the first widely adopted cryptocurrency created in 2009 by Satoshi Nakamoto. The purpose of bitcoin is to allow one person to directly send money to another in a transaction known as peer-to-peer without trusted third party like a bank or PayPal to process it. In other words, banks and governments cannot control bitcoin and so cannot control its users.

### HOW DO YOU USE BITCOIN TO PAY?

Install a Wallet of Satoshi bitcoin wallet on your phone from the Living Room of Satoshi website - the simplest Lightning Network wallet. Use your bitcoin wallet app on your phone to scan the barcode. Once confirmed you will generate payment to wherever it needs to go.





The WSC is allocating \$150,000.00 of the recently awarded Grant (Combating Pests & Weeds) towards the management of weeds across the Winton Shire Area.

The Program will involve the following actions:

- The completion and submission of this Expression of Interest form by Landholders to the WSC,
- WSC shall oversee the purchasing through local suppliers, of the following: Starane Advanced/ Uptake Spraying Oil/ Tebuthiuron Granulated Pellets and a Spray Unit,
- Landholders will be notified of the quantity of herbicide they are eligible for by 30<sup>th</sup> November 2019,
- WSC shall oversee the distribution of herbicides and the hiring of the spray unit to landholders,
- Landholders will have until the 30<sup>th</sup> June 2020 to complete all spraying activities.

#### **SNAKE AWARENESS**

Winton Shire Council would like to advise the community that there has been several snake sightings in the past few weeks, given the recent change to warmer weather.

We recommend you take the below precautions to prevent injuries from occurring:

#### Backyards

Make your backyard unsuitable for snakes by having garden beds away from the house. Keep the lawn well maintained and low in height.

#### Homes

Stop snakes entering your home by screening doors and windows, and blocking all potential entry points.

If a snake finds its way into your home, close your internal doors, open your external doors and give the snake a chance to leave.

Never interfere with snakes. They will defend themselves. A high proportion of snakebites have resulted from people trying to handle, interfere with or kill snakes.

#### Piles and compost

Always ensure that timber piles are neatly stacked preventing shelter for rodents and snakes. Tidy up your yard during the colder months when snakes are less active.

Place food scraps in closed compost bins to make sure that rodents aren't attracted to your home.

#### **Nurseries and aviaries**

Keep your nursery and greenhouse tidy. The warm environment can attract snakes.

Rats and birds attract snakes. Make your bird aviaries rat and snake-proof. Store bird seed in rodent-proof containers.


#### Gardening and yard work

When gardening, wear gloves, long pants and covered shoes.

Always lift objects so that they face away from you. This reduces the likelihood of putting yourself in a dangerous situation if a snake is sheltering underneath.

#### The outdoors

- always stay on formed paths or tracks so that you can see and avoid snakes,
- carry a first aid kit that contains pressure bandages with you,
- always wear protective clothing such as covered shoes and trousers, and
  - carry a torch at night so that you can see where you are going.

#### **RED RIDGE – "TRAILBLAZING THE WEST" PROJECT**

Earlier this year, the Winton Shire Council was approached by Red Ridge (Interior Queensland) Ltd to participate in their "Trailblazing the West" project. #### **ELDERSLIE STREET PROJECT UPDATE**

With the Outback Festival behind us, it is great to see the turf stood up very well to the heavy foot traffic after only being down for four weeks. It will now get some extra care and attention and will look in top shape in no time. There are still some trees and additional plants to be installed as they become available from the suppliers.

We still have further structural works to complete the project and this week should see the arrival of a truck load of shelter structures, furniture and planter boxes. These items are for the centre median which will necessitate some temporary road closures as the installations occur. The shelters for each side of the street for the al fresco areas on the footpaths will follow in about four weeks.

In addition, sealing of the concrete joints on the footpaths will occur over the following weeks. This will involve barricading off small sections of footpath, grinding out the joints and then applying the sealant before moving to the next section. This will only have a minimal impact in the street.

Once all installations have been completed, the opal print and dinosaur prints in the road surface will take place which will complete the picture.

#### WINTON WAY OUT WEST FEST

The Winton 'Way Out West Fest' was established in conjunction with the re-opening of the Waltzing Matilda Centre in April 2018 and attracted many thousands of visitors over four days of great entertainment. This was at a time when the community and local businesses were doing it tough, dealing with drought and population decline. Given the community acceptance of this inaugural event, the Council delivered a second event in 2019 which once again, provided a considerable cash injection for our local businesses and provided a great spectacle for locals and visitors alike.

Despite reducing costs for the second event, a shortfall in tickets sales compared to the previous year, resulted in a negative financial result for this event. At the September 2019 Council Meeting, a petition was received, signed by many locals requesting Council make this an annual event and arrange for a third "Way Out West Fest" to be held in 2020. Council is most appreciative of the community support it has received for this event, however for this event to be held in the future, a review and restructure of the event is required to mitigate against future financial risks for Council.

For this to occur and given April / May appears the best event date, there will be no "Way Out West Fest" in 2020. However, Council has resolved: -

- THAT Council agrees to hold a third Winton Way Out West Fest in 2021 with the event date and method of delivery to be determined and subject to the availability and securing of headline performer/s.

Council can appreciate this decision will create some disappointment for sections of our community, however we are faced with many competing priorities including aged care facilities, public infrastructure and the increasing cost of providing council services. Council remains supportive of the Winton Way Out West Fest, however the cost of holding this event cannot be at the detriment of the wider community.

#### WINTON "BUY LOCAL" GIFT CARDS

Following the February 2019 Monsoon Flood disaster, the Winton Shire Council was provided with Commonwealth Category D – Exceptional Circumstances funding to the value of \$1m. From this funding, the North-West Queensland Flood Disaster Carcass Disposal Strategic Master Plan was developed, and Council administered payments of \$5,000 per property to assist with carcass disposals. A total of \$685,000 was paid to eligible landowners within the Winton Shire. This left a balance of \$315,000 to be used on priorities deemed most urgent to Council associated with the event.

After much consideration, Council decided to use the balance of the funding on purchasing and distributing preloaded Winton 'Buy Local' gift cards (1,000 cards @ \$300 plus costs) for community members within the shire. Following this flood event, Council considered our **local businesses** were greatly disadvantaged, even though they suffered minimal flood damage, the town was isolated and the flow of visitors stopped. Compensation was not available to offset this financial hardship so the Winton 'Buy Local' gift card was considered the best option to support our community and local businesses.

The "Buy Local" Gift Cards will be available Monday 21 October – Friday 25 October 2019 between the hours of 9am – 6pm from the Winton Shire Council Foyer (the first door from Werna Street), please only use this door. (If you need any further information please don't hesitate to call 4657 2666 ask for Helen Fogarty or email <u>helenf@winton.qld.gov.au</u>).

The guidelines for the distribution of the Winton 'Buy Local' Cash Card are as follows: -

a. Each Winton 'Buy Local' Gift Card will be pre-loaded with \$300 and shall be valid for a period of 12 months from 15 October 2019;

b. The cards will only be valid within the Winton Shire Council area;

c. To be eligible to receive a Winton 'Buy Local' Gift Card, the resident's name must be listed on the current Electoral Roll for the Winton Shire Council or be a resident with proof of residing in Winton;

d. Cards will be distributed from the Winton Shire Council Foyer only;

e. Before a card is issued to a resident, the resident will need to provide a form of identification (eg drivers licence, Medicare card, pension card etc) satisfactory to staff and must sign for the card;

f. Only 1 card will be issued per person, and lost cards will not be replaced;

g. Cards will be issued to an individual in person only;

h. To be eligible to receive a card, the resident must be over 18 years of age.

If you're not available to pick the "Buy Local Gift Cards from Monday 21 to Friday 25 October, they will still be available for when you're able to. If you have any concerns please email helenf@winton.qld.gov.au.










