A NEW ERA FOR THE ROYAL THEATRE WINTON

The Royal Theatre Winton has been the centre of the local culture and social scene since 1918. Now, 103 years later, the theatre is operated by a not-for-profit group called Winton Movies Inc. (WMI). The team is 100% volunteer based and they are motivated to contribute to the local community through restoration of the theatre, bringing new events to Winton and regular movie screenings. Jeff Close is the WMI Chairperson, "Our purpose is centred on promoting film and cultural experiences for the benefit of the local Winton community and our many visitors the Queensland Outback. We strongly believe the theatre can be an iconic creative and cultural epicentre for the Winton community." If you haven't visited the theatre this year, you'll will love the renovations and improvements already completed. In February the Candy Bar and Foyer had a complete makeover and it has become a crowning glory for the theatre. In addition, the Museum has become a major feature having been relocated to the street frontage, 100 new canvas seats have been added and the bathrooms have been upgraded. Jeff explains, "we still have a lot of work to be done. The next priority project is to enclose the projector room so that we can protect the digital projector and we are making plans for further upgrades, when we raise the funds." The upgrades and renovations are being



funded through grass roots fundraising and grants. The team have just launched a limited number of Foundation Memberships so you can directly contribute to the preservation of Royal Theatre Winton and be part of its future. As a Royal Foundation Member, a nameplate will be dedicated to the member and will be proudly displayed on one of the iconic canvas chairs in the theatre – your own Royal Deckchair. 

CORRECTION TO ARTICLE 9th July 2021

The Editors recently received an email about an article we ran in the 9 July 2021 edition that had some incorrect information. We are therefore printing an amendment with the correct information

The article made reference to the house, 'Yelvertoft', in Charters Towers, once owned by James Mitchell of Winton. It said, in part: "The house was then transported from Winton to Charters Towers." This statement is incorrect. 'Yelvertoft' was never moved to Winton. Other houses had already been brought to Winton from Charters Towers.

Here is some further information which might be of interest.

'Yelvertoft' was built about 1906 for David Rollston, a leading mine manager in Charters Towers. The house was named after the village in which Rollston was born in Northamptonshire, England. Rollston died in 1912. His three surviving sons were already established on the land, so they put 'Yelvertoft' on the market. In 1917, probably in the early part of the year, James Mitchell bought it for a 'couple of thousand pounds' with the intention of moving it to Windermere, his property to the south of Winton. It was soon realised that 'Yelvertoft' was too large to be moved. It was realised, however, that the house provided new opportunities for the education of Mitchell's children.

Three of the Mitchell children were withdrawn from the Winton school in May 1917, and were enrolled in Charters Towers schools. At that stage neither Thornburgh nor Blackheath had opened. James and Frank were two of the initial eleven students enrolled at Thornburgh College in June 1919. Catherine eventually enrolled at Blackheath in 1921.

James Mitchell spent little time in Charters Towers, preferring to remain in Winton with his business, though he did join the Civic Club in Charters Towers. James and his eldest son, Alexander William (Willie), remained in Winton while his wife (Eva) and the other five children lived in 'Yelvertoft' for a few years. Mitchell put 'Yelvertoft' on the market in June 1919 at £2000. It was sold to Rev. Francis Bacon during the first half of 1920, at a price which attracted a reference to Mitchell's "great generosity". The first students were enrolled there on 1 October 1920. Eva Mitchell returned to Winton along with her daughter Jess, who enrolled in the Winton school in June of that year. She became a student at Blackheath in 1929 but remained for a year only.

The Blackheath property was placed on the market in 1982, and the remaining students left there in the following year. As your article says, the building was destroyed by fire in 1992. It was the second Charters Towers heritage building in six months to fall victim to fire.

This updated information has been provided by Brian Hedges, husband of Jean who is one of the grand-daughters of James and Eva Mitchell.

ROMA'S CROSS LOADER FACILITY DEDICATED TO BUDDO GRANT

IOR Petroleum is proud to have installed a brand-new cattle cross loader facility at its Roma diesel stop, adjacent to the breakdown pad. Roma has been selected for this safety initiative as the end of the triple road train route and home of the largest livestock selling centre in the Southern Hemisphere. It is well known that the traditional method of transferring cattle between road train crates is considered one of the most dangerous activities for both drivers and livestock in the transport supply chain. The cross-loader is available for the industry to access for free as IOR seeks to help improve productivity, safety for livestock transport drivers, and animal welfare. Speaking about bringing the project to life, IOR Managing Director; Stewart Morland, said that it would not have been possible without collaboration and support from organisations throughout the region. "We would like to acknowledge Maranoa Regional Council for providing materials in-kind from the Maranoa Council Quarry, a significant portion of the overall project costs. We would also like to thank RyTrans, Roma Transport Services, and the Livestock and Rural Transporters Association of Queensland Inc. who were strong advocates for the initiative", Mr Morland said.

The Roma facility has been modelled on IOR's popular cattle cross loader facility in Port Augusta, South Australia used by Australia's essential livestock transport drivers.

Stephanie Grant wife of the late Buddo Grant traveled to Roma with her family to officially open the new cross loader facility on Thursday the 15th of July. This facility has been dedicated to Buddo who was a stalwart member of the Transport Industry for over 35 years. The Winton IOR fuel site was the first unmanned site for IOR with Buddo being their first customer back in 2005.

NEW CONTAINER REFUND POINT FOR WINTON

Winton residents have a new place to return eligible beverage containers for a 10-cent refund through the Containers for Change scheme.

Outwest Container Exchange is now receiving containers for refund every Saturday morning at the Eric Lenton Memorial Recreation Grounds. The previous refund point on Elderslie Street is no longer accepting containers. The new pop-up refund point opened on July 10 and will be open every Saturday at the recreation grounds between 8am and noon.



The Containers for Change scheme offers a 10-cent refund for every eligible container returned at a registered refund point in Queensland. Queenslanders have proven themselves avid recyclers, with more than 4 billion containers and over \$400 million in refunds claimed since the scheme was implemented in late 2018. This has contributed to a 54 per cent decrease in beverage container litter in the environment. “It is important that everyone in our regional areas has access to recycling,” said Ken Noye, chief executive of Container Exchange, the not-for profit organisation that administers the Containers for Change scheme. “Together we are making a positive impact on local communities and the environment, but there is more work to do. “We urge everyone in Winton to use the pop-up refund point on Saturdays and claim the cash in their containers.” Winton residents can access the refund point by entering the Memorial Recreation Grounds via Fraser Street.




