Winton Shire Council Mayor's Message



We are fortunate to live in a community where volunteering is a part of who we are and there is always someone willing to give a hand. I would like to congratulate all the committees who have had a successful event over the last couple of months. It's great to see the high attendance at these events after the disappointment of last year. One thing

COVID did was make us aware of how much goes on in this small community.

The Queensland Boulder Opal Association once again put Winton on the map with the Queen of Gems Jewellery Design Awards and Opal Festival. It was fantastic to see so many artists, jewellers and miners at the event.

I would also like to commend the Winton Camel Races for a fantastic event. The eight-race program and novelty events were a big hit and closed out the tourist season with a bang.



The Wild Dog Management Public Meeting was also held this month. Council has once again committed \$260,000 to Wild Dog Management in our local government area. All exclusion fencing is now complete with a total of 8 properties receiving funding from Council through the Federal Governments Feral Pest Fencing Program totalling \$800,000.

It has been 2 years since the establishment of the Neighbours of Bladensburg National Park and I have had several meetings with State Ministers and Queensland Parks and Wildlife. Neither are supportive of exclusion fencing the Park but are in agreeance of aerial and ground baiting in areas where the public don't access.

We also had discussions with Michael Kaminski who would like to put motion cameras on properties to collate data and statistics of wild dogs. This information will go a long way when applying for funding and I ask that graziers consider the arrangement.



I would also like to thank Ben Ogg for his time as Chairman of the Committee and welcome John Banning as our new Chairman.



The "Real" Corfield races were held recently after a year off due to COVID. This was a great day with many locals and visitors in attendance. Once again there was plenty of entrants in the "Fashions of The Field" with the ladies looking fantastic, I'm glad I wasn't a judge as this would have been a difficult task.

Councillors, Senior Management and I attended the Opalton Public Meeting on Sunday 8th August. This is always a great day with many miners and locals in attendance. We took this opportunity to discuss the 2021/22 WSC Budget and engage about the issues at Opalton that council can assist with.

While there we visited the proposed site for the Opalton Exhibition and Visitor Information Centre that is going to be constructed. This will be a great complex that will help attract more visitors to not only Opalton but Winton as well. Council is also working with Telstra to install a small cell tower at Opalton like the one that has just been commissioned at Middleton. Hopefully we can see this completed by the end of the year. Thank you to the QBOA for hosting us and putting on a fantastic lunch. I encourage everyone to get out and spend a day at Opalton.



The inspections and cleaning of grids, in our Shire, has commenced. Work has begun in the northern end of the shire and will progress South. This may take several months but once completed we'll have all the grids cleaned out and a register for maintenance and replacement of the grids.

COVID is still a serious risk to our community as we've witnessed recently with the cabin crew scare on the Qantaslink flight. It is important for everyone to follow the directions of the Chief Health Officer. Queensland Health guidelines recommend anyone with symptoms, no matter how mild, should get tested as soon as possible. Please keep yourselves, family, friends and our community safe.

It's been a huge few months for Simone Sorensen and her horses. Simone competed at the IOR Darling Downs Interschool Championships in May. Here she competed with Yalambi's Karijini in the 1.20m class where they won the championship and Caboonbah Baileys was the Champion secondary 1m horse. Both horses had to jump 3 rounds at their respective heights.

Simone then competed at the Gatton World Cup Championships. Here Caboonbah Baileys and Bayview Wishlist competed in the 1.1 – 1.15m Newcomers Championships both just missing out on a placing. Yalambi's Karijini competed in the 1.2m Junior Championship. After 3 rounds they finished 6th against Australia's best junior riders. A fantastic result for them.



In July Simone travelled to Maryborough for the Hygain Interschool State Championships for a massive 4 days of competitions in wet and cold conditions.

With record nominations Simone was there for the experience and to support her Fairholme College team mates and did not have any expectations. Caboonbah Baileys competed in 3 rounds of Showjumping in the Secondary 1m class and placed 3rd overall.

Yalambi's Karijini competed in the Secondary 65cm Working Hunter Show horse class. It was a huge surprise when they were placed as Reserve Champion. Karijini also competed in the 1.20m Secondary Showjumping. After 3 rounds of jumping, they finished 4th overall which gained them a place in the Qld Interschool State team to compete in December at Werribee, VIC.

Simone was also a member of the Reserve Champion team for show horse and champion secondary Showjumping team. Congratulations to the Fairholme girls on this win.

The competition year is still not over as Simone hopes to travel to Victoria for the Australian Showjumping Championships if Covid permits, as well as plenty of other competitions that are coming up over the next 5 months.

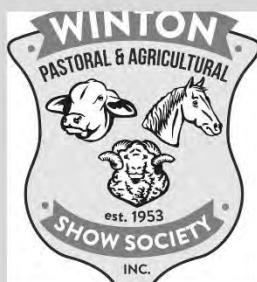

ON THIS DAY –

On this day in 1956 the Central Queensland Herald reported a "Wild brawl in Winton Street"

More than 60 old and new rate shearers clashed in a wild free-for-all in Winton on Saturday. THE brawl, which began in a hotel bar and ended in the street outside.

One shearer was taken to hospital with scalp wounds. He is Barry Grant, 24, married, of Winton. The Winton Hospital said tonight that Grant's condition was satisfactory, but he was being kept in hospital for few days.

The fighting began in the bar of the hotel about 1:30p.m. after loud arguing between the shearers and shouts of "Scabs* by old rate men. Within minutes the crowded bar was spattered with blood as men closed in swinging wildly. The fight spilled out into the street where a large crowd blocked the street to watch.

Only one constable was on duty at the Winton Police station at the time. He ran to the scene but could not separate the men. He called for help "in the name of the law" and a few bystanders moved in to break up the fighting.

Two other members of Winton four-man police unit were called on duty to stop the brawl. New fighting broke out later behind another hotel, but soon broke up.

WORST CLASH.

Winton residents said tonight was the town's fifth and most serious clash between shearers in the past few months.

Some declared that yesterday's brawl had been secretly "arranged" between the two groups of shearers as a test of strength.

Police at Winton said today they had made no arrests as a result of the brawl but were "making investigations."

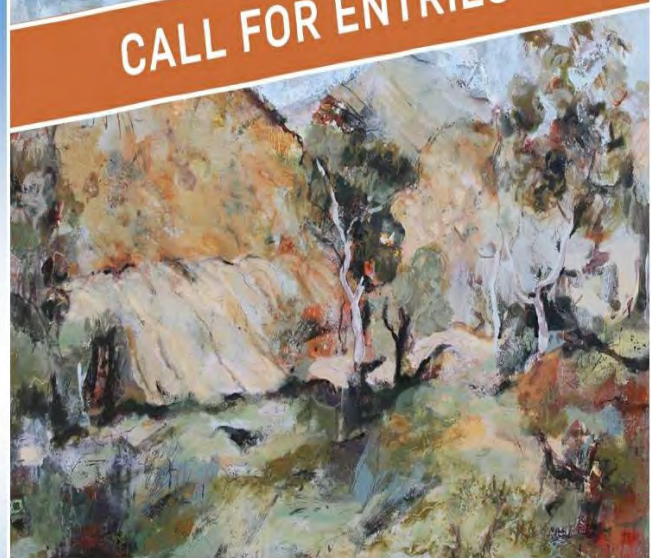
