A TOUR THROUGH THE BACK COUNTRY – ADVENTURES ON THE PLAINS BOGGED IN THE SOIL

Article submitted by WDHS - EXTRACTS FROM THE QUEENSLANDER JUNE 8, 1895.

The rain which fell in fitful showers during Saturday forenoon gathered in strength during Saturday night. While the banquet was in progress in Steele's Hall it peppered unpleasant reminders of the morrow on the roof. The party had had a taste of what a few points of rain could do with the roads; what a few inches were capable of was an experience yet to be gained.....One thing was certain, when Sunday dawned, that there was no leaving Winton that day.....Towards midday, there was a break, and it was thought that by the next day the roads would be at least passable. Some of the residents smiled.....

...it was decided to continue by buggy. Mr. Nicholson, Cobb and Co's manager, was counsellor, advisor and guide. Cobb and Co had a buckboard in the yard, and Mr Corfield would not only lend his cross-country buggy, but he would drive it himself. At about 7.30 on the Monday morning, therefore, Mr Corfield drew his four ponies up at Lynett's Hotel, Mr Nelson and Mr Philp preferring to ride with him.....Mr Nicholson came up a quarter of an hour later for the other members of the party.....an hour and a half later the pioneer buggy was seen on ahead - stopped. Mr Corfield was up to his ankles in the black soil industriously cleaning the wheels.....It was decided that Mr Nicholson should act as pioneer as far as Oondooroo.....the buildings forming Oondooroo home station were seen miles before they were reached. They stand on an imposing eminence; they are snow white even to the roofing. Twenty minutes later the four ponies and Mr Corfield came in.....

Some of the party partook of refreshments at Oondooroo, which has the appearance of being one of the largest stations in the district. It is said to be thoroughly well equipped in fire detecting and other useful appliances.....the Premier transhipped to Mr Nicholson's buggy at Oondooroo....On leaving the station at 2.15 pm, the main Hughenden road was forsaken, the buggies going by the woolshed, seven miles distant.....The road had been bad enough from Winton to Oondooroo: it was ten times worse between the woolshed and Oleo, the next stage.....as the party progressed it became more and more evident that it would be impossible to reach Manuka station (seventeen miles beyond Oleo) as had been proposed.....By sheer hard work Mr Corfield's horses were got within two or three miles of Oleo.....then the vehicle became hopelessly bogged.....The decision was that the horses should be taken out and led to Oleo, the buggy being left to take its chance. And so the travellers set out to walk the two miles odd of the most tiresome country anyone could wish to discover. It was now nearly 10 pm.....On the unfortunates tramped....it was not until half past 11 pm that they reached the stage.....Mr Nicholson managed to get the derelict buggy in somewhere about midnight. How he had managed it the party did not know: what they did know was that 2in. of rain in the back country was something that had to be reckoned with.

Progress Ass members are giving all necessary volunteer labour to make it so. Last Saturday morning they organised a working bee to pull bull rushers from the dam, a service that will be greatly appreciated by swimming enthusiasts. Vaccinations for 5-11 year olds are very important

- COVID-19 is a serious illness that can affect 5-11 year olds as well.
- Getting vaccinated can help prevent your child from becoming seriously unwell, and make them less likely to pass COVID-19 on to vulnerable family and community members.
- The Pfizer (Comirnaty) vaccine has been clinically tested and proven safe and effective for people aged 5 years and older.

Dosage

- Children aged 5–11 years receive a smaller dose (10 micrograms) of the Pfizer (Comirnaty) vaccine than those aged 12 years and over (30 micrograms)

Interval

- For children aged 5–11 years, the second dose of the Pfizer (Comirnaty) vaccine is recommended to be administered 8 weeks after the first dose.

Parent/guardian consent

- Consent from a parent/guardian is required and information and forms are available when you make your booking.

On vaccination day

- Parents/guardians are required to accompany 5-11 year olds.
- Winton Medical Practice immunisers are specially trained to provide paediatric vaccinations.
- Please bring your Medicare card and Driver's Licence.
- Winton Medical Practice also provides free Pfizer COVID-19 vaccinations for everyone aged 12 years and over, and family bookings are welcome.

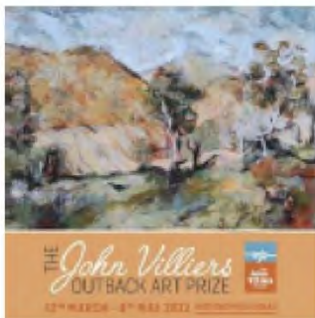

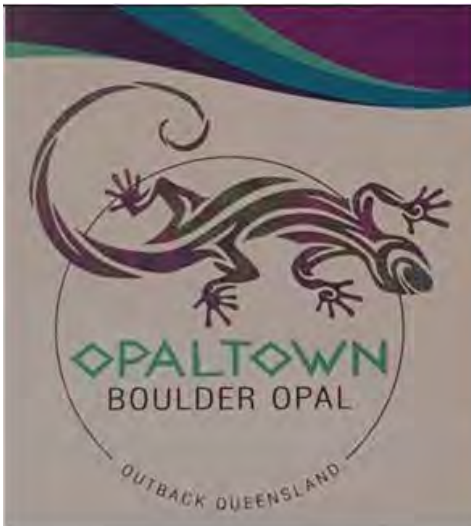
