Kelly was acknowledged for his efforts in Rugby League by receiving the Central West Coaches Award for Under 15's and his Nomination for the NQ Junior Sports Star Award.

Additional to his football, Kelly represented his school at Central West and Northwest Level in Swimming, Cross Country and Athletics.



THE CONFUSION OF A STREET NAME

"The town map shows Nesbit Street. This street was named after James Nisbet. If this is so, then why is it spelled differently. Is it possible for someone to please provide the correct spelling? Everyone in town spells it differently and it causes much confusion."

Response from Helen Collins WDHS

Thank you for your enquiry re the correct spelling of Nisbet Street in Winton. This question has been extensively discussed earlier this year with the Winton Shire Council, where the correct spelling as Nisbet Street and Nisbet Lane was confirmed.

Briefly the evidence is as follows.

- James Nisbet founded Oondooroo about 1874 and sold to the Scholicks about 1878. He was only in the district about 4½ years, and had left before Winton town was gazetted in 1879 and the first town survey in 1880.
- when Nisbit street was given that spelling after the third survey in 1899, it was 20 years since James Nisbet had left Winton, after a very brief residence. Few locals would have known him, and those who did have a memory of him, would have given verbal advice which was written down by the surveyor the way it sounded.
- the variant spellings of Nisbet in the Winton district, as in Nesbitt Creek, Nesbitt bore, Nesbitt parish, newspaper reports in the 1950s etc, are further examples of words being written the way they sounded, by later generations with no direct contact with the person involved.

The Winton District Historical Society holds the memoirs of James Nisbet and a photograph of his gravestone, if further documentary evidence is required.


