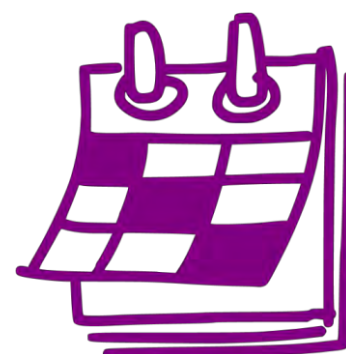

FLIPPING BACK THE YEARS

WINTON HERALD - DECEMBER 1ST 1936

HAMMONDS CASH AND CARRY STORES

There are two of these stores, one at the corner of Manuka and Vindex Streets under the Management of Mrs Hammond, and the other at the corner of Vindex and Werna Streets managed by Mr Hammond.

Grocery, Crockery, fancy goods, confectionery and bottled drinks, Ice Creams, Cakes and Provera Bread are only a few of the lines carried. These people have shown great enterprise, which we hope will be aptly rewarded.

GREGORY NEWS - JUNE 15TH 1903

In the Police Court on Wednesday last before the police magistrate James Williams, otherwise "Jimmy Hardface" pleaded guilty to drunkenness and using obscene language.

For the drunkenness he was discharged with a Caution and for the language, fined 2 pound in default 14 days imprisonment.

GREGORY NEWS - SEPTEMBER 30TH 1898

There is some talk of trying to arrange a swimming carnival at the Bore Dam on some date near at hand.

With such a fine sheet of water so near, it should certainly be not difficult matter to arrange, and, if the swimmers appear in the usual "Varsity Costume"- sleeveless jerseys and knickers, ladies might attend and a large muster assured.



CAPRICORNIA NEWS, JUNE 22, 1894

Winton May 24th -

The Longreach Coach due this day last week came in on Saturday Night over three days late, having been caught in a heavy downpour of rain at Eversham Country.

The passengers left the Coach and walked thirteen miles under the heavy rain to Griers Hotel where they were delayed three days.

Fortunately, they did not cause a famine there - Mr Grier had abundant for their wants.

One passenger, Mr E Jowett of Kynuna, did not stay till the coach could travel, by getting a horse and rode onto town, 50 miles.

The town is lively tonight with a shooting gallery and a merry-go-round, the latter patronized by the Winton children who have never before except in a dream or a picture book seen anything of the sort.

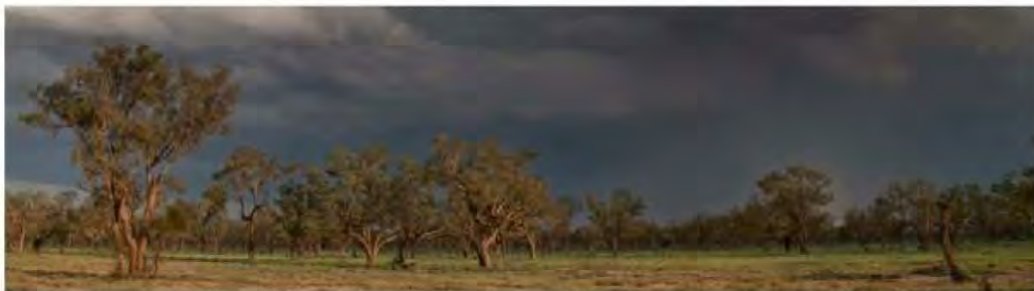

AFTER HAVING COVID

For the next 7 days after ending isolation

You can go to work or school or return to your normal activities.

You don't need a negative test result to go back to work or study. There is no need to show a negative test to your employer or educational institution.

This is because most people who get COVID-19 will continue to test positive for some time after they have recovered, even though they no longer have COVID-19 and are no longer infectious.

If you leave your house:

- wear a face mask, including whenever you are indoors, or when you're outdoors but can't socially distance
- wash your hands regularly.

A child under 12 years old is not required to wear a face mask for 7 days after ending their isolation, however a school may require a student to wear one as part of their policies for health and safety reasons.

Don't visit these settings unless for a permitted limited purpose and you have advised them you are a diagnosed person in isolation in advance:

- an aged care facility
- a disability care setting
- a correctional facility like a prison
- a healthcare facility like a GP or a hospital.

You can go to these places if you work there or you are getting care.

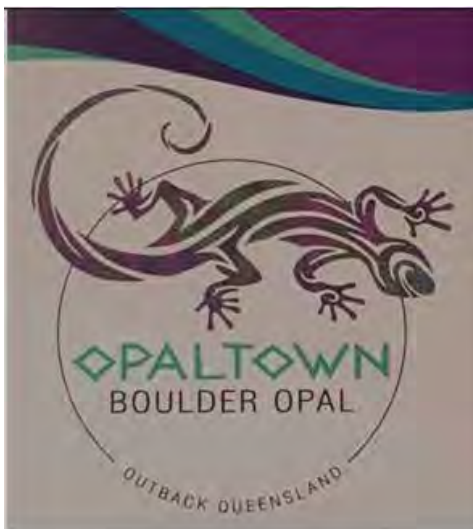
