



OUTBACK ADVENTURING - COVID STYLE

Since 1991, the epic Winton Camp has been a much-anticipated rite of passage for A.B. Paterson College Year 6 students - a character-building, nine-day trek.

There was no chance the College - located on the Gold Coast - would let a worldwide pandemic get in the way of this magical milestone, so...

If A.B. Paterson College students can't travel to Winton, the College will bring Winton to the students!

Staff worked tirelessly to create a two-day virtual Winton experience for Year 6 students, on the Gold Coast campus, complete with a video conference connection to the Whitehead family at Mentone Station, recording of traditional poetry performances to be played in the Waltzing Matilda Centre in Winton, a host of fun bush-related activities, a Service-learning session with Save the Bilby Fund, an augmented reality dinosaur experience, sausage sizzle, movie night and talent show.

The Outback Queensland community has pitched in, offering resources from attractions such as the QANTAS Founders Museum, Charleville Cosmos Centre & Observatory and Australian Age of Dinosaurs. Students enjoyed video presentations from Ayrshire Downs station, and a magical poetry recital and history lesson by local Greg North, on location at Combo Waterhole.

The annual camp is much anticipated by the Winton community, as the College has built a very strong relationship with the region over the past 30 years.



Winton Mayor, Gavin Baskett, sent video well-wishes that were played to the students during their Winton 'on-campus' experience.

"It's very disappointing you couldn't make it this year," he said. "I love catching up with the kids, going to the Waltzing Matilda Centre and listening to the poems that you perform. We're looking forward to next year, and future years. We've built a great relationship with the College and students over the years, and we want to keep that moving forward."

A.B. Paterson College Principal/Head of College, Joanne Sheehy said, "As an adult, I know how much COVID-19 has impacted our school year, but our students are not dwelling on that. They have shown amazing resilience. They know it is a changed experience, and they are embracing every moment they have to work with their peers and their teachers."




