

## ICPA – ISOLATED CHILDRENS PARENTS ASSOCIATION

**Does the name Isolated Children's Parents' Association ring a bell? What about ICPA? Do you know anything at all about our volunteer, non-for-profit, apolitical organisation?**

The ICPA Winton Branch is a dedicated group of individuals working towards equal education for our rural kids both in and out of town. But rather than tell you about our history, (check out our website – [www.icpa.com.au](http://www.icpa.com.au)), we would like to tell you about how ICPA is important to OUR Winton community and what we've done and will continue to do for our local children.

Firstly, our members' issues concerning their children's education - whether it is lack of specialist subjects, teacher retention issues, poor internet access or sporting disadvantages – are lobbied by ICPA State and Federal Councillors to relevant government ministers and departments. In the past two years at ICPA QLD State Conferences, our branch has lobbied for the following concerns and achieved great results.

- We fought for the retention of increased bandwidth for Distance Education subjects during the COVID-19 periods of home schooling – this motion was passed and Education Queensland agreed to maintain that level of bandwidth saving money for rural families.
- We also ensured that funding for the Longreach State High School's hospitality facilities was fairly allocated to adequately upgrade the Big Red Truck for the benefit of the Winton State School senior students and our community.


Finally, many of our fundraising efforts ensure that we can continue to sponsor pre-service teachers during their placements at our Winton schools.

In the last year, our branch offered financial support to both Stacey Sanders and Campbell Evans during their final placements. Having experienced everything that the Winton Shire and surrounds had to offer, they were both eager to stay! In Term 3, 2021, Stacey and Campbell commenced their employment as teachers in Winton. And from what we have heard, they are invaluable additions to their schools and their students. It is wonderful to see them thriving as teachers and members of our community and we hope they continue to enjoy their time in Winton!





### ANNUAL REPORT

It's been another busy year for Council and it is particularly pleasing to see the progress on the new residential estate behind the Hospital. These new blocks should become available in the first half of 2022. It is also great to see the new stables under construction at the showgrounds which will be a much-improved facility for future events. The Parks and Gardens team are to be congratulated on maintaining Elderslie Street, the Recreation Grounds and the whole town in general to such a high standard for our residents and visitors. The Council has received great feedback on these facilities from many people who attended the wide range of events over the last 12 months.

- Some projects completed during the 2020-2021 financial year include: -
- Hughenden Road Pave and Seal completed to a high standard;
- Richmond / Winton Road Pave and Seal with additional works in the pipeline to progress the completion of this road sealing project within the Winton area;
- Concrete floodways on the Diamantina River Road;
- Sealing of the access road into the Lark Quarry Dinosaur National Monument;
- Sealing of a further section of the Winton / Jundah Road;

Our Works team have had another busy and successful year and I take this opportunity to highlight other projects which have been completed due to funding being made available: -

- Transport and Main Roads Projects;
- Transport and Main Roads – Road Maintenance Performance Contract (RMPC);
- Transport and Main Roads – Transport Infrastructure Development Scheme (TIDS);
- Transport and Main Roads – Transport and Tourism Connections (TTC);
- Queensland Reconstruction Authority Flood Damage Projects;
- Queensland Reconstruction Authority Betterment Projects;
- Australian Government Roads to Recovery Projects;
- Stabilising and Sealing works on the Winton / Richmond Road.

The RMPC Contracts with Transport and Main Roads include: -

- Schedule 1 - Maintenance of State Controlled roads;
- Schedule 2 - Management of Declared Pest and Weeds State Control roads;
- Schedule 3 - Incident Management;
- Schedule 6 - Reseal Preparation works also Rural Maintenance works – Emergency works on the Diamantina River Road and Winton Jundah roads.

Town Maintenance and Construction Works include Kerb and Channel Rehabilitation in Oondooroo Street (200m between Elderslie Street to Vindex Street on the West side) and a spoon drain at the Musical Fence site. The crews have been working on replacing footpaths and pram ramps around the town to reduce potential trip hazards. I once again commend both the Roads and Parks & Gardens crews for the exceptional work they are doing including the line marking and painting of the garden beds. It is also worth noting the last conditional assessment on our road network presented a very positive result with only 1.1% of our roads being in bad condition.

Grid Maintenance – The Works Section have established a new grid maintenance program to ensure they are operational and effective. A total of 160 grids out of 260 have been inspected in the Shire for defects and cleanliness and a cleaning program has started using a rating program by condition of grids in our local areas.



Rural Roads – Rural road maintenance has been progressing well. Crews have been intergrading maintenance works in with the flood damage program. This will enable Council to get a better value for money out of both programs. Roads that are not part of the flood damage program will be monitored and maintenance will be conducted as needed. Rural Reseals on the Jundah Road and Jundah / Cork Road have been completed.

Capital Works – Reconstruction of Floodway’s – During the 2020 / 2021 flood events, some of Council’s floodway infrastructure was damaged which made them eligible for funding under the Queensland Reconstruction Authority Betterment Works funding. Council were granted six floodway reconstruction works ranging from full reconstruction to installing new margins with all projects completed before the end of the financial year.

In terms of the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA) received through the Queensland Reconstruction Authority, we will have just under \$9m for the year ahead. Further works to be completed are new sections of the Winton / Richmond Road and the Winton / Hughenden Road, along with improvements to the rural roads network. Additional funding has been allocated to these areas which will enable Council to concentrate on the areas that require the works.

Having worked in this industry for the past 44 years, it is a good feeling to be able to put something back into my community. Through our regular meetings with Staff and Management, we can set goals which result in positive outcomes for both the people of Winton and the rural community. In terms of our Water and Sewerage infrastructure, new lines were installed where required including a new 150mm poly line from the town to the showgrounds to improve water flow. The maintenance of this infrastructure is a key priority for Council and staff in this area are doing a great job in monitoring these essential services.

Shire Plant and Equipment – The plant replacement program is on track with the delivery of 2 x new Cat Graders with older machines being sold via tender. Plant is assessed at regular meetings of the Streets and Machinery Advisory Committee to see how we are going against budget.

Airport Development and Infrastructure – Recent improvements include the installation of a new AV Gas tank with other improvements being considered including new Precision Approach Path Indicator (PAPI) lighting and a new Jet A1 Fuel tank. These improvements will attract more jet planes and visitors into Winton to enjoy what we have to offer.

The feedback from visitors is our little community is wonderful, friendly and vibrant as we battle to keep things green and growing in this climate.

As a local, I love seeing people being involved in community events and committees as I am with the Winton Men’s Shed. It is very pleasing and rewarding to be able to share some quality time with the older and younger people of Winton. I also represent Council on the Board of the Waltzing Matilda Centre Limited, Chair of the Streets and Machinery Advisory Committee and the WORC Camp. I am also on the Board of the Outback Highway which will see visitor’s travelling on a sealed road from Cairns to Winton and across the middle of the country to Laverton in Western Australia on the Outback Highway. I am also involved in trying to erect a lagoon / bird habitat at the South-Western entrance to Winton, to complete the walking track and have a recreation area for both the people of Winton and visitors alike and like so many other organisations, I am always open to giving a hand.

I would like to end this note by saying I am here for the long haul, I love Winton and the community which make up this wonderful part of Australia.
