

HISTORY IN WINTON

THE LONGREACH LEADER January 1924

A disastrous fire occurred in Winton, when nearly all of the south side of Elderslie Street was burnt to the ground, including the Australian and Club Hotels. Damage was estimated at between 80,000 and 100,000 pounds. The fire raged for two hours.

The places destroyed were The Club Hotel, Turners Tent Factory, Winton Butchering Co (ice works and butcher shop), Brettles Cycle Shop, Shorts Tailors, Sorohens refreshment rooms, The Australian Hotel, McIntosh's Office, Kitchingmans (tobacconist & hairdresser shop), Greens Chemist shop, Pengallys Jewellers, Dunns Bootmaker, Marshells Bookseller.

The fire was reported to have broken out in Sorohens.

NEW STAMP MACHINE 8th November 1950

A new stamp machine has now been installed and ready for public use at the Winton Post Office. The machine provides for purchase of stamps of halfpenny and two penny denominations by the simple method of inserting a halfpenny for that stamp and two pennies for a two-penny stamp.

Worked on the slot system, it represents boom to both town and country people and will no doubt be of special use to those country people who make a special trip to town at night or in holiday periods.

NO VANDALISM WANTED

Although the machine has been in use for a few days, already vandals have been at work. Only yesterday, advises the Postmaster, some "person" had inserted a bent hatpin into the machine preventing it from functioning. This sort of hooliganism cannot be tolerated and the public is asked to co-operate in preventing persons tampering with the machine.

1974 article regarding a 14- goat team from 1916

Remember Winton's goats?

■ THE MOST CAPRICIOUS team in the old West? Toughened old bullockies would probably have paled at the thought of whipping this 14-goat team into order.

■ Mr. Norman Duncan, of St. Lucia, dug up this old photograph taken by his father, Captain James Duncan, in the Western Queensland town of Winton in 1916.

He was only three at that time, but he recalls that the team belonged to an old pioneering family who were too poor to afford horses, or even bullocks.

So when they moved from Longreach to Winton, 179 km away, they harnessed up their 14 goats in front of the shafts of their cart — and shifted their household

possessions halus bolus by goat dray.

Every boy wanted to have his own billy goat in those days, according to Mr. Duncan. (Maybe today's equivalent would be a mini-bike).

And these two stalwart lads, complete with pioneering braces and vests, must have been the envy of the local push.

They earned their pocket money by carting loads of wood around the district.

Captain Duncan must have caught them as their delivery service arrived in the main street of Winton.




