Winton students set for industry exposure in the city

Exposure to industries in the city will be a highlight for Winton State High School's trade students, thanks in part to \$25,482 secured through the Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal's Tackling Tough Times Together (TTTT) program, Maranoa MP David Littleproud said.

“Trade students from the Winton State High School will have a great opportunity to head to the city and learn about hospitality and tourism,” Mr Littleproud said.

“The trip will expand students' minds about the world of food and tourism – important experiences for our youth to have when it comes to figuring out what career avenue they want to pursue.

“The students will travel with their peers from Longreach, Barcaldine, Blackall and Aramac high schools with the help of \$25,482 through TTTT.”

In total, Maranoa communities secured \$294,686 through Round 15 of the TTTT grant program.

The Federal Government is providing a total of \$15 million, through the Tackling Tough Times Together initiative - also supported by philanthropy and business - to New South Wales, Queensland, Victoria, South Australia and the Northern Territory.

The majority of projects funded in this round seek to reduce volunteer fatigue and boost the operations of local not-for-profit organisations in drought communities.

The Federal Government is backing drought-affected communities by providing more than \$8 billion in drought assistance and concessional loans to support those experiencing hardship.

To the people of Winton Shire, I Travis Harbour wish to put forward my nomination for Mayor for the 2020 Local Government Election.

Re-Structure, Re-Engage, Re-Invigorate - Winton

"We are at a pivotal point in the timeline of Winton and we need a change in Leadership Style and Direction that will capitalise on our opportunities.

I urge all voters to give careful consideration when casting your vote at the upcoming Local Government Elections. Who do you feel is best to advocate for you and for your town? Who is best to provide strong, open, honest and inclusive Leadership? actions speak louder than words".

Re-Structure

- We need clear lines of Management, Leadership and Accountability, to provide stability and assurance for our community.
- We need to strive for a more, cost effective and more productive workforce, that is able to adapt and deal with the challenges of a changing and less consistent funding streams.
- We need to grow a strong, sustainable Local Council workforce.
- We need our elected Councillors to set the Directions for Council and we require the Council Administration arm to follow and facilitate these objectives in an appropriate and timely manner.
- We need strong Leadership that is willing and able to "Direct" the CEO.
- We need a Leadership that will keep all Councillors informed on all Council matters. Councillors should not be finding out what is happening by hearing it up the main street.
- Strong adaptive Leadership is required to deliver and accommodate for differences of opinion's, but still be able to work professionally and positively as part of a team for the betterment of the Winton Shire.
- Effective Leadership is required that is able to react and take the necessary action, to rectify situations that have may have changed or that are non-compliant or no longer relevant.
- Strong Leadership is required when dealing with matters surrounding underperforming and over budgeted projects.
- Companies and contractors need to be accountable for the work they perform for Council.
- Effective Leadership should ensure Council expect that contracts are completed on time and on budget.
- Establish a Rate Payers Committee to review Council finances and expenditure.
- It is not private money, it is Rate payer money, it is Tax payer money, **it is Your Money**, and it needs to be spent wisely and with total accountability.

Re-Engage

- Council needs to become far more accessible and provide far greater transparency and accountability to the community.
- ***No more*** "Late Decisional Reports" that are provided to Councillors on the night before or the morning of a Council meeting. This process does not allow for any time for Councillors to investigate the issues and does not allow for Community involvement.
- There needs to be an informed Decision-Making process on every decision. This is only possible if consultations and investigations have been allowed to take place.

- Council needs to place the Full Council Agenda and Business paper on the website **at least 7** days prior to a Council meeting. This would allow for the public to know what decisions your Council will be voting on, and provide time for you to lobby your individual Councillors on any upcoming matter.
- After the Agenda and Business Paper have been made public, encourage members of the public to write a letter or email to Council and make time at every meeting, for members of the public to make an in-person presentation (Deputation) to Council, on each matter that is going before Council, that may affect you or that you are passionate about.
- The Mayoral role has now become a full-time position. During work hours, when not in meetings or on Council Business, the Mayor should be available to the public for interaction and consultation.
- If elected Mayor, there will be a Mayoral office in the Main street, for the community to easily access the Mayor during those times. When present, this office will be open and available to the public, to drop in have a chat, and discuss any issues as needed.

Re-Invigorate

- We need to up lift and promote all our industries a lot better, our Opal Industry, our Film Industry, our Tourism Industry, our Agricultural Industry, our Transport Industry, our Rail Industry, and our other retail and small businesses.
- Dinosaurs are a great attraction, but they are not going to be the sole saviour of Winton.
- More promotion and utilisation of our 23 Million Dollar Waltzing Matilda Centre. This is a National narrative that Winton owns, and it should not be playing second fiddle to anything.
- Promote and Lobby to attract funding for **all** parts of our Community, festivals and events.
- Highlight and promote our unique pristine and postcard perfect natural sites/landscapes.
- Cut through the “Red Tape” to encourage and facilitate the creation of new businesses and enterprises, that will create jobs for the town, to reverse our ageing and declining population.
- Continue to support an Aged Care facility to be built here in Winton.
- Future Planning- who will fill our vacant houses, as we transition into an Aged care facility.
- Cement and lock in Winton as the “Hub” for the Australian Outback Film Industry.
- Formalise a direct targeted campaign and create a specific department, to attract and facilitate future Film and TV ventures here in Winton. If we don’t, another town will.





WINTON “BUY LOCAL” GIFT CARDS

Have you just moved to town? You may be eligible for a “Buy Local” Gift Card.

Cards will be distributed from the Winton Shire Council Main Office. Please bring proof of residing in Winton.

If you do not want a Buy Local Card for yourself you can give it to a Local Community group in need.

The Buy Local Card will be available at the upcoming Meet and Greet Event, held at the Waltzing Matilda Centre.

The guidelines for the distribution of the Winton “Buy Local” Cash Card are as follows: -

- a) Each Winton ‘Buy Local’ Gift Card will be pre-loaded with \$300 and shall be valid for a period of 12 months;
- b) The cards will only be valid within the Winton Shire Council area;
- c) To be eligible to receive a Winton ‘Buy Local’ Gift Card, the resident’s name must be listed on the current Electoral Roll for the Winton Shire Council or be a resident with proof of residing in Winton;
- d) Cards will be distributed from the Winton Shire Council Main Office;
- e) Before a card is issued, the resident will need to provide a form of identification (e.g. drivers licence, Medicare card, pension card etc.) satisfactory to staff and must sign for the card;
- f) Only 1 card will be issued per person, and lost cards will not be replaced;
- g) Cards will be issued to an individual in person only;

To be eligible to receive a card, the resident must be over 18 years of age.

Following the February 2019 Monsoon Flood disaster, the Winton Shire Council was provided with Commonwealth Category D – Exceptional Circumstances funding to the value of \$1m. From this funding, the North-West Queensland Flood Disaster Carcass Disposal Strategic Master Plan was developed, and Council administered payments of \$5,000 per property to assist with carcass disposals. A total of \$685,000 was paid to eligible landowners within the Winton Shire. This left a balance of \$315,000 to be used on priorities deemed most urgent to Council associated with the event.

After much consideration, Council decided to use the balance of the funding on purchasing and distributing pre-loaded Winton ‘Buy Local’ gift cards (1,000 cards @ \$300 plus costs) for community members within the shire. Following this flood event, Council considered our **local businesses** were greatly disadvantaged, even though they suffered minimal flood damage, the town was isolated and the flow of visitors stopped. Compensation was not available to offset this financial hardship so the Winton ‘Buy Local’ gift card was considered the best option to support our community and local businesses.

Each Winton ‘Buy Local’ Gift Card will be pre-loaded with \$300 and shall be valid for a period of 12 months from 15 October 2019.


