GEORGE McBRIDE OAM (cont'd from 23 April)

George met his future wife Joyce McGlynn in 1940 at a dance at Archerfield Brisbane where he was stationed for a time. They married in 1946 on his discharge from the RAAF and began a long life together. The couple initially settled in Cairns where he took up a position as an aircraft engineer, and they started a family. In 1952, wanting to forge his own way, he and a



partner took over an engineering business and car dealership in the Queensland outback town of Winton, servicing the local grazing properties and airport. These turned out to be hard years dealing with lighting plants, windmills, cars and trucks, radios and so forth. It was a tough life for the family, but it was here he developed the confidence that would propel him throughout the remainder of his life. Speaking of this time, he said he resolved in himself to continue

throughout his life to take on things that were beyond what he thought he could comfortably do. He certainly did this.

He left Winton in 1964 after a long drought decimated the area, taking on a short stint in Glen Innes turning around a failed car dealership. From there in 1966 the family relocated to Mackay where he initially worked as Service Manager before taking on the role of Manager of the company's Tractor and Machinery Division, where he thrived. These were extremely fruitful years that gave his creative nature and seemingly inexhaustible energy space to express itself.



The sugar industry was beginning some highly transformational years, particularly with sugar farming taking major steps increasing mechanization and improving productivity. Being in tune with the needs of the farming community, he encouraged and assisted equipment suppliers and manufacturers to refine and develop their products, while developing a very service orientated business encouraging the uptake of new and more efficient practices. At one time the Division absorbed the total output of Toft cane harvesters and also become Australia's largest dealer of Case construction equipment.

In an innovative move, he presented his own weekly live radio show on 4MK Mackay called 'Country Comment' where he attracted the farming and town community alike. Feeling he had achieved his goals, he left Mackay in 1980 to work for several more years as Project Manager for Austral Motors, a tractor and machinery State distributor, before retiring

to the Sunshine Coast. However, for anyone who knew George, retirement was only really another chapter. He now threw himself into Community Service projects, which had already been a major theme in his life.

It was at Winton where he began his involvement on Community Service by forming, plus helped build, an RSL Branch, for which he was given a Life Membership and was President for 7 years. He also became a Winton Shire Councillor and served on the Hospital and Fire Boards.

But the Lions Club was his main passion and he remained an active member until shortly before his death. Mackay was where he first became a member, joining the Pioneer Valley Club and later establishing a new charter, the Northern Beaches Club, becoming its President. In the Sunshine Coast he was extremely active in clubs at Cooroy/Pomona and Palmwoods.

He is a recipient of the Lions Club highest award- the Melvin Jones Fellowship Award- for his service to the Lions community. He was given a

Life Member of Meals on Meals for creating a service in Cooran/Pomona. For Services to the Community, he was awarded an Order of Australia Medal (OAM).

George was a man of seemingly inexhaustible energy. He was a man who always had a new idea; a man who saw barriers as being there to be broken through and the utter belief if things didn't quite go totally as planned, he had the confidence and talent to recover and make it happen. He never failed to inspire others. If there ever was a man who encapsulated the concept 'there is always a way', it was George.

He always had deep concerns and interest in the young generation and as an expression of his feeling he wrote and self-published "Car Book for the New Driver" which became a standard addition to Community and School Libraries around the country.

George and Joyce were married for 71 years but their adventure together ended with her sad passing in 2017. He is survived by his four sons Brian, Graham, Noel and Paul; 9 grandchildren and 3 great grandchildren. He really was a force of nature.

Members of the QANTAS Board travelled to Winton last week to join the Winton – Birthplace of QANTAS celebrations. Board Chairman Richard Goyder AO was joined in the Boardroom at the Winton Club where the first QANTAS Board meeting was held on the

10th February 1921 by his fellow Board Members Michael L'Estrange, Barbara Ward AM, Paul Rayner, Todd Sampson and Belinda Hutchinson AC. Joining the table was CEO Alan Joyce AC. Speaking in Longreach the next day, Mr Joyce said that meeting in the original room was one of his highlights.

Special guest was Fergus McMaster II, grandson of

Winton grazier and businessperson Fergus McMaster who was instrumental in the founding of QANTAS.

QANTAS CEO Alan Joyce in response quoted the company he leads "was conceived in Cloncurry, born in Winton and grew up in Longreach."

While in Winton the Redtails commemorated ANZAC Day, lunched at the Winton Club, visited shops in town and the Waltzing Matilda Centre and were taken on a guided tour of significant QANTAS sites in Winton.



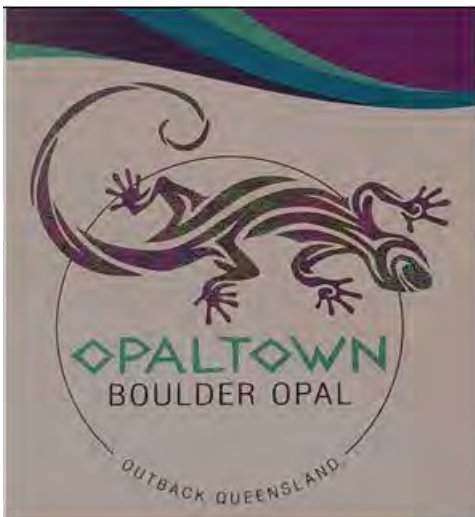
