JOHN PATRICK D'ARCY


On Thursday, 6 May 2021, members of the D'Arcy family gathered at the Winton Cemetery to honour the military service of their great great uncle, John Patrick D'Arcy, who served in the American Civil War.

Through the efforts of James Gray, Commander of the Sons of Confederate Veterans Inc, and the extensive research of Dianne Hensler (nee D'Arcy), a bronze memorial plaque and certificate were issued by the American Veterans Administration.



John Patrick
D'Arcy, born
in Edenderry,

Ireland in June 1839 was the third of eight children to Edward D'Arcy and Catherine Dunne.



The American Civil War (1861 – 1865) had commenced by the time he arrived in New York. He enlisted as a Private in the Union Army, Co I, 1st Marine Artillery Unit from April 1862 to March 1863. During this time on the gunboats, he suffered injuries and was honourably discharged when his unit was disbanded at the end of March 1863.

John went back to Ireland and along with his younger brother, Laurence Patrick, came to Australia on the

‘Sultana’ in 1864. His two brothers, Robert Joseph and Edward James had already established themselves around Queensland.



John, a widower, married Mary Kate Templeman in 1874 and with her son, Robert, settled down in Rockhampton. He worked as a butcher for many years in Brisbane and then gained employment as a labourer in various parts of Queensland before settling in Winton around 1905.

In 1892 John applied for a US War Veterans pension which was duly issued. His wife, Mary, continued to receive a widow's pension after his death.

John worked as a storekeeper at Elderslie Station until his death on the 7 February 1913 aged



74 years. It was noted in the "Catholic Leader" on the 3 April 1913 that John was a "very old and respected resident".

Along with the assistance of Karen Bates and Tiffany Nielson at the Winton Shire Council, the installation of this plaque on John's grave commemorates his contribution to the importance of democracy, ideals by which he lived his life as a resident in his new homeland and his community.
