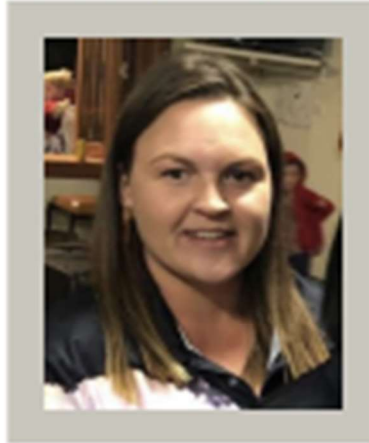

The Australian Age of Dinosaurs Museum is looking for up to **200 cubic metres** of black ironstone to put around the new Gondwana Stars Observatory, which is under construction at Dinosaur Canyon. Weathered black ironstone on ridges that can be scraped up with a front-end loader would be suitable, provided a reasonable quantity is available in one area.

The Gondwana Stars Observatory is being rendered with jet-black concrete to resemble a meteorite and the ironstone is needed as a top surface to create an impact-crater effect around the building. 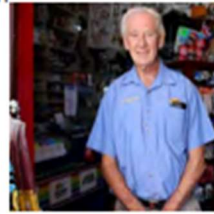
