

Support is now available to primary producers impacted by the Western Queensland Floods Exclusion Fencing Recovery Grant of up to \$500,000 to rebuild damaged or destroyed exclusion and cluster fencing infrastructure and help contain and protect surviving livestock.

This program is being delivered in partnership with <u>RAPAD</u> throughout the region's eligible Local Government Areas: Barcaldine, Barcoo, Blackall-Tambo, Boulia, Diamantina, Longreach and Winton.

Stronger Homes Grant Up to \$10,000 to improve



Works Department

Works and Utilities

Our Works Department have been busy working on the following projects:

- Cemetery extension Fencing works are complete, irrigation will be installed followed by the lawn.
- Dog Park Replacement turf has been installed and the Park has re-opened for business.
- Works have commenced at Gordon Kennedy Park in readiness for planting of the cycads.
- Landfill operations The installation of new designated drop off bays at the landfill is working well. Thank you to the community for embracing the change. Having designated drop off points improves safety to the general waste pit and allows for the separation of waste streams.
- Showgrounds Bar and Kitchen construction is on track for completion and is now at lock up stage.





- Neighbourhood Centre Carpark Two carports have been installed
- Footpaths Works are complete at Diamantina Gardens which has seen a footpath installed and new
 and improved landing areas in front of each Unit. The landing areas combined with the new paths will
 significantly improve accessibility for residents and visitors to Diamantina Gardens Units. Work also
 included modifying the access alongside the Medical Centre to install a new kerb ramp for improved
 access from Diamantina Gardens Units to the Medical centre.





Roadworks - Construction work on the next stage of sealing Winton Jundah Road is progressing.


M PROTECT YOUR PROPERTY FROM LOCUSTS

Recent wet weather has created perfect conditions for locust outbreaks across parts of the state. Biosecurity Queensland is calling on graziers and landholders to step up now and take proactive measures to manage the risk of swarms.

Locusts can cause major damage to your pastures and crops, hitting local industries and communities hard. Under the Biosecurity Act 2014, you have a general biosecurity obligation to take reasonable steps to minimise the risk of locust populations building up on your land.

Early action is key! Search for nymph activity, act quickly, and spray early to protect your land and prevent swarms from forming. Locust management is a shared responsibility, and timely action can make a difference.

While locusts are native to Australia and can't be eradicated, effective management through coordinated efforts is well within our reach.

WILD DOG BOUNTY PROGRAM NOW OPEN

Winton Shire Council's **Wild Dog Bounty Program has now reopened** for the 2025–2026 financial year. This program supports landholders, property managers, and accredited harvesters in the ongoing management of wild dog populations. Bounties will be processed while funds remain available under the current budget allocation.

Earlier this year, widespread flooding across the region led to the **cancellation of the scheduled aerial baiting campaign**, placing added pressure on ground control efforts. The reopening of the bounty program aims to help offset this disruption and support local landholders in continuing essential pest management activities.

Properties currently experiencing high wild dog numbers or stock losses are encouraged to contact their Division Leaders to discuss baiting options. Orders for ground baits can be arranged to assist with targeted control efforts in affected areas.

We thank the community for their patience and ongoing involvement in protecting our livestock and native wildlife from wild dog impacts.

77 FLOOD-DAMAGED FENCING – TOWN COMMON

The tender period for the flood fencing repairs on the Winton Town Common has now closed, with Council currently finalising the assessment of submitted applications.

The flooding event earlier this year caused significant damage to the Winton Town Common boundary fencing, with around 20km of the 54km perimeter affected. This included key sections adjoining Bladensburg National Park, resulting in livestock straying beyond the common boundary.

Council thanks all common users and neighbours for their patience and cooperation during this recovery process.

UPCOMING WINTON TOWN COMMON MUSTER

The town common is due to be mustered once again. Likely this will occur in either august or September. The confirmed date will depend on livestock condition, feed availability and community events which may be in conflict with the muster.

The Bladensburg ranger has not reported any further sightings of livestock on the common and at this time council will not be getting a permit to check the national park.

Back tank upgrades:

The fencing at the rear of the Common water tanks has now been completed, securing the facility for the long term. This preventative measure will protect the tank fittings from livestock damage and prevent erosion around the tank base. It's a long-overdue project, and it's great to see it finally finished.

★ INVASIVE WEED MANAGEMENT & BIOSECURITY OBLIGATIONS POST-FLOODING

The recent flooding event has created favourable conditions for the spread of invasive weeds across the Winton Shire Council and surrounding areas. These weeds threaten pasture quality, livestock health, and native biodiversity.

All landholders have a general biosecurity obligation to actively manage and prevent the spread of biosecurity matter, including invasive weeds, on their properties. Early detection and control are essential to protecting our shared environment and agricultural productivity.

If you notice invasive weeds or require assistance, please contact the Rural Lands Team.


