



## Mayor's Message

As we welcomed the arrival of spring this September, it's been heartening to see our shire bustling with visitors and renewed energy after a quiet start to the tourism season.

The Outback Festival once again provided a fitting finale to the tourist season. The festival lived up to its reputation of quirky outback events such as the famous Quiton Dunny Derby, Iron Man and Iron Woman & Junior, and the Yabby Races just to name a few. Congratulations to the committee and volunteers who continue to make this iconic festival such a success. Also, congratulations to all the competitors in all the events over the 5 days. It was wonderful to see so many families and friends reunite and enjoying the packed program of events.

It was a great honour to attend the unveiling of the Ray Hermann statue during the Outback Festival – a fantastic monument celebrating the legacy of "The Winton Whiz." This initiative by the Diamantina Rodeo & Campdraft Association Inc. recognises Ray Hermann's extraordinary rodeo career and his lifelong contribution to the Winton community. The statue is based on Darryl Doyle's famous 1985 photograph of Ray riding Gill Bros' 'Brock' at Dingo, Queensland, and was brought to life by sculptors Tom and Travis Tischler, featuring Ray's original riding gear. Winton Shire Council contributed \$90,000 towards the statue, with the remaining funds raised through generous donations and the efforts of the Diamantina Rodeo & Campdraft Association.

Council has also endorsed its Economic Development Strategy 2025–2029 – a comprehensive framework to guide sustainable economic growth, attract new investment, and create opportunities across the region. The Strategy sets a clear vision for Winton Shire, building on our strengths in agriculture, tourism, events, and opal mining, while embracing new opportunities in small business, innovation, and regional partnerships. 




## Regional Tourism Infrastructure Fund

Winton Shire Council recently welcomed members of the Local Government Association of Queensland (LGAQ) Policy Executive team ahead of their meeting in Longreach. Hosted by Mayor Cathy White, the visit highlighted Winton's world-class tourism attractions and facilities, including the Australian Age of Dinosaurs Museum, Waltzing Matilda Centre and the Country Universities Centre.

Policy Executive members heard directly from local operators about both the opportunities and challenges facing the tourism industry, particularly the impacts of recent floods and the resilience shown in recovery. The visit also provided a valuable forum for councils to share broader challenges, such as the urgent need for sustainable childcare funding in rural and remote communities.

#### Work Camp Boys Revive Historic Willie Mar's Fruit & Vegetable Garden

Winton is celebrating the restoration of one of its most treasured landmarks — Willie Mar's Fruit & Vegetable Shop and Market Garden. After the devastating 2025 floods left the site in disarray, the Winton Work Camp boys stepped in to clear debris and repair walkways. Thanks to their efforts, the garden is once again ready to welcome locals and visitors. This project honours the legacy of Willie Mar and his family, whose hard work and fresh produce supported Winton for decades, while also giving Work Camp participants valuable skills and experience.

#### Musical Fence Sign Update - In time for the Outback Festival

The Works Department has refreshed multiple signs at the iconic Musical Fence, just in time for the Outback Festival. This update prepare\ds the venue for a special performance by travelling musicians Topology, who presented their Sunrise Performance "Wired for Sound 150 at the Musical Fence" on Saturday 27 September at 7:00am, proudly supported by Arts Queensland.

#### Solar Light Installation Show Grounds Footpath

This project involves the supply and installation of solar lights along the new footpath on Cork Street leading towards the Showgrounds. The project is fully funded by the Australian Government under the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program. The procurement process is complete, and the lights have been received. The supplier has confirmed that the other components have been dispatched. The lights selected are fully compliant with the requirements of Dark Sky Certification. The project remains within the approved funding envelope and is scheduled for completion prior to the program's funding deadline.

#### **Planting of Cycads**

The planting of cycads and understorey plants alongside the "Winton Sign" at Gordon Kennedy Park has been completed. All cycads have now been planted, kindly donated by Cycad International, significantly improving the visual presentation of this prominent entrance feature.

#### **Winton Hotel**

Balustrades at the Winton Hotel have been installed as part of the capital works program.

# **Rural Lands**

#### **Mater Facility Maintenance & Upgrades**

Ongoing inspections and repairs are improving water infrastructure across the shire:

- Canis and Etna facilities have had repairs and funding applications submitted.
- Ayrshire turkey nest is being treated for seepage with bentonite.
- Quotes are underway for projects at 12 Mile, Dicks Creek, Fieldings, Nadjayamba, Strathfillian, and The Grove.
- Overflow management at **Vindex Tank** has helped prevent erosion.

#### Wild Dog Management Update

The Wild Dog Bounty Program continues to support landholders in managing pest populations.

- July saw 96 scalps processed after claim reviews.
- August had 15 scalps submitted.
- Landholders experiencing high wild dog activity are encouraged to contact their Division Leaders to arrange baiting support.

#### Upcoming Winton Town Common Muster

The town common is due to be mustered once again. This will occur October 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup>. The confirmed date was moved into October due to the levels of water and feed availability, as well as to avoid community event clashes.

The Bladensburg Ranger has not reported any further sightings of livestock off the common and at this time council will not be getting a permit to check the national park.

#### **X INVASIVE WEED MANAGEMENT & BIOSECURITY OBLIGATIONS POST-FLOODING**

The recent flooding event has created favourable conditions for the spread of invasive weeds across the Winton Shire Council and surrounding areas. These weeds threaten pasture quality, livestock health, and native biodiversity.

All landholders have a general biosecurity obligation to actively manage and prevent the spread of biosecurity matter, including invasive weeds, on their properties. Early detection and control are essential to protecting our shared environment and agricultural productivity.

## Outback Regional Gallery

Joe Furlonger: Horizons is a Queensland Art Gallery | Gallery of Modern Art exhibit that ran from 16 August to 6 October. The exhibition of paintings, drawings and ceramics is currently touring Queensland galleries and included three significant artworks from the Outback Regional Gallery collection. Special thanks to Simon Wright, Assistant Director Learning and Engagement QAGOMA, for officially opening the exhibition.

Exhibition Outback in 3D showcases sculptural objects from the Outback Regional Gallery's collection and the diversity of mediums utilised by the artists to depict the Outback region. The exhibition will open 10 October and be on display until 2 November.

The Outback Regional Gallery and Outback Futures facilitated social wellbeing and visual arts workshops to the children at the St. Patricks School. The program is accepting artworks from ages 5-15 years and exclusively for young artists in the RAPAD region. The project is generously sponsored by The John Villiers Trust and will be exhibited both digitally and alongside the 2026 John Villiers Outback Art Prize.







Ink in the Lines an Australian War Memorial Touring Exhibition will open at the Outback Regional Gallery on November 11. The exhibition reveals how Australian Veterans, and their families share personal stories and experiences through tattoos. Player District President RSL North Queensland District will travel to Winton to officially open the exhibition on the evening of Remembrance Day.




## **Council's Event Calendar**


