BIOSECURITY TIDBITS

Biosecurity definitions

GBO: Under the Biosecurity Act 2014, everyone in Queensland has a general biosecurity obligation (GBO) to ensure that they do not spread a pest, disease or a contaminant.

Invasive: Invasive species are animals, plants, parasites or disease- causing organisms that establish outside their natural range and become pests. Native species can also become invasive if transferred outside their natural range.

Restricted Matter: Restricted matter is listed in the Act and includes a range of invasive plants that are present in Queensland. These invasive plants are having significant adverse impacts in Queensland and it is desirable to manage them and prevent their spread, thereby protecting uninfested parts of the State.

Stock Route and Common Maintenance

The recent common muster in Winton showcased improving compliance among participants, indicating a positive trend. The common in Winton boasts good pasture supporting the local livestock.

Additionally, with no drovers applying to travel through the shire this year, feed along the stock route remains ample. Winton Shire Council plans to initiate



works in May on water facilities along the stock route as part of the leaky bore program, enhancing water accessibility for both livestock and community needs.

Dog Bounty Program Update

The budgeted scalps for the wild dog bounty were met in April. With all 150 scalps being claimed the bounty program has concluded for the financial year. Loretta Searle continued the tradition of placing a wreath at the ANZAC Day dawn service on behalf of Winton's 60 & Better group.





Boat and Jet Ski Licence Course

The Neighbourhood Centre

Instructors from Allstate Boat Licensing & Training, who came all the way from Yeppoon, led the course and highlighted key safety measures, stressing the importance of water safety and mutual care. Participants had the chance to experience riding a jet ski and operating a 6-meter boat. While some were initially hesitant about driving the boat, it's safe to say that many left the course with a newfound interest in owning their own watercraft.

Waltzing Matilda Day

It was begun to use local skills and knowledge to add to patron's understanding of Australia's national song, with words written in the Winton district by Banjo Paterson in 1895, and music based on a tune remembered by Christina Macpherson of Dagworth Station.

Patrons were able to take away wool sample, see the crimp in the wool, smell the natural lanolin and pet the sheep. The freshly shorn wool was then taken to the Sarah Riley theatre veranda where Bente Moller spun the wool into yarn.



There was a Waltzing Matilda Day cake as well as tea and coffee for the approximate 80 guests. All the Winton Shire Council Councillors were able to be present and Deputy Mayor Tina Elliott cut the cake and declared the proceedings open. Background to the morning tea were the colour in competition entries coordinated by Robyn Stephens.
