# January 2024

Below is a snapshot of Decisional Reports from the January Council Meeting. A highlight of this meeting was the sale of the block of land on the Longreach Rd for the construction of accommodation and the contract being awarded for the construction of the Youth Centre. As well as the below Decisional Reports Council was presented the second quarterly report on the outcomes delivered against the Operation Plan for the year ended 30 June 2024.

This was the last meeting before Council went into caretaker mode prior to the Local Government elections. For a full copy of the January Minutes and Business Paper please visit our website. The next Council meeting will be at the WSC Chambers on the 14th of March.

### 13.1 WSC\_HSQF\_POL\_014 Social Housing Tenancy Management Policy

 THAT the existing Council Housing Policy and the Independent Aged Accommodation Policy be discontinued, and that Council adopt the WSC\_HSQF\_POL\_014 Social Housing Tenancy Management Policy.

### 13.2 60 & Better Service Agreement

 THAT the Chief Executive Officer be authorised to provide written notification to the Department of Seniors, Disability Services and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Partnerships accepting the offer.

### 13.3 Community Care Updated Policies

- THAT Council adopt the following policies:
  - A. WSC-CCS-POL-025 Antimicrobial Stewardship Policy;
  - B. WSC-CCS-POL-16 Restrictive Practice Policy; and
  - C. WSC-CCS-POL-011 End of Life Care Policy.

# 13.4 Rescind Previous Resolution - Preferred Supplier Arrangement for the Supply of Baiting Meat Substrate

- THAT Council rescinds the previous decision to establish a Register of Preferred Supplier Arrangement (PSA), for the Supply of Baiting Meat Substrate.
- THAT Council notifies the Respondents accordingly.
- THAT Council initiates a Request for Quotation for the Supply of Baiting Meat Substrate as required.

### 13.5 Local Laws

 That public feedback on the advertised draft local laws be considered, and changes be incorporated in the final local laws.

- THAT the Public Interest Review Report on the anti-competitive provisions contained in proposed Subordinate Local Law No. 1 (Administration) 2024 and proposed Subordinate Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2024 be received.
- THAT the Public Interest Report's recommendation that the anticompetitive provisions contained in the proposed subordinate local laws are in the public interest and should be retained.
- THAT Council resolves to make the following local and subordinate local laws as advertised:
  - A. Repealing Local Law No. 1 (Miscellaneous) 2024
  - B. Subordinate Local Law No. 1 (Administration) 2024
  - C. Subordinate Local Law No. 3 (Community and Environmental Management) 2024
  - D. Subordinate Local Law No. 4 (Local Government Controlled Areas, Facilities and Roads) 2024
- THAT additional provisions in relation to dangerous dogs be incorporated into proposed Subordinate Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2024 and that it be noted that no community consultation is considered necessary for these provisions as they are minor in nature.
- THAT Council resolves to make Subordinate Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2024, which has been amended, since it was publicly advertised, to include the following additional provisions in relation to dangerous dogs and amendments to the designated town area: the following local and subordinate local laws as advertised:
  - A. In column 1 of schedule 5, insertion of a new row relating to a declared dangerous dog, declared menacing dog or restricted dog (as defined within the Animal Management (Cats and Dogs) Act 2008))
  - B. In column 2 of schedule 5, inserting new minimum standards for the keeping of such dogs, to ensure that enclosures for these dogs cannot be accessed by visitors without the assistance of an adult occupier and are constructed of adequate materials.
  - C. Substituting the map of the designated town area in Schedule 11.

### 18.1 Evaluation of Tender for Sale of Council Owned Land.

This report seeks Council approval for the sale of Council owned land, being Lot1 on SP 335297 Landsborough Highway. Public Tender process has been completed with only one Response received, that being from IRBS Trust.

### 18.2 Youth Centre Construction WSCT-2324-05

As part of Council's Asset Management, Enhancement and Community response, it was identified that there was a need for a new Youth Centre that will also be used as an Evacuation Centre in times of a disaster. Furthermore, this facility is designed to cater to the needs of the younger population in the Community, providing a dedicated space for various activities, programs, and services aimed at fostering their development and wellbeing. The centre is envisioned as a hub for social, educational, and recreational activities, offering a range of resources and opportunities to engage and support the youth community.

- THAT Council engages Kent Construction to build the Youth Centre as per Kent Constructions original Tendered amount of \$2,286,900.00 (excl. GST)
- Council completes the Excavations, Earthworks and Concrete Works and deducts these amounts from the Tendered Rates
- Council takes out a Loan or uses Reserves to fund the shortfall

# February 2024

Below is a snapshot of Decisional Reports from the February Council Meeting, there was plenty of correspondence for this meeting but a standout was a letter from the Minister for Environment regarding the purchase of properties for National Parks and the impact on our economy, including Opal mining. Council's resolution was: "To continue to lobby both sides of state politics to highlight the impacts these decisions will have on the local economy, industries and community."

# 13.1 Local Disaster Management Group - Appoint New Chair Election Period

During the local government election period following confirmation of election results, but before the first meeting of the new Council, at which the appointments of chair and deputy chair of the Local Disaster Management Group (LDMG) will be made, the role of chair and deputy chair of the LDMG will be vacant for a short period of time. This is not appropriate if an emergency arises during this period. The LDMG has therefore nominated Mr Gavin Baskett to be the chair of the LDMG during this period. Council is being asked to ratify this nomination to ensure the role is filled during the short period, before the new Mayor and Councillors are installed and the new LDMG appointments can be made.

 That Council ratifies the nomination of Mr Gavin Baskett, and appoints him as the chair of the Winton LDMG, during the period following confirmation of the results of the 2024 local government elections and the formal appointment of the new chair and deputy chair at the new Council's first meeting.

# 13.2 Academic Bursary Policy and Application Form

The tertiary entry requirements for Queensland tertiary institutions have changed from Overall Position to Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR). This means that documents that referred to Overall Position (OP) now need to be updated.

• That the proposed amendment to the wording of WSC-ADM-POL-013 Academic Bursary Policy and WSC-ADM-FRM-013 Academic Bursary Application be adopted.

### 13.3 Advisory Committee Policy and Terms of Reference

- That the WSC-GOV-PWI-001 Advisory Committee Terms of Reference be updated to include the word "resident" as recommended in dot point 5 of the Tourism and Beautification Advisory Committee purpose.
- That the WSC-GOV-POL-008 Advisory Committee Policy is not updated

### 13.4 Community Grants Requests

Council is committed to supporting not-for-profit community organisations that support the needs and liveability of the Winton community. This report is a reflection of the expenses during the 2023–2024 financial year thus far, and to present further Community Grant Requests which have been received

- THAT Council does accept the request from the Diamantina Rodeo and Campdraft Association for cash and in-kind assistance in the amount of \$8040.21 for the 2024 Winton Campdraft
- THAT Council does accept the request from the Winton Pastoral and Agricultural Show Society for the in-kind costs of erecting and dismantling of the large marquee and hire of chairs and tables for the amount of \$3725.61.
- THAT Council does accept the request from GWAU KOA Aboriginal Corporation for in-kind assistance in the amount of \$1028.52.

### 13.5 Community Care Unspent Funds

In 2021, the Australian Government implemented changes to the way providers of Home Care Packages were paid. Providers began receiving funding based on the actual services delivered to care recipients in the previous month rather than being responsible for the whole package funds. Prior to this any unspent amount would accrue in a home care account created and maintained by the service provider, being Winton Shire Council. Council currently holds accumulated funds of client package unspent funds.

- THAT Council:
  - A. Does nothing and when each of the 5 clients cease their home care package, Council would then be billed from Services Australia for the unspent funds.

# **RURAL LANDS**

### **Water Facilities**

With recent rainfall, the water facilities for the turkey nests have been replenished, albeit unevenly due to patchy rain. Hopefully, further precipitation will ensure all turkey nests are adequately filled, setting them up for a successful year ahead.

### **Post Wet Biosecurity**

With the abundant rainfall this year, there's a heightened risk of invasive pests being displaced. The Council urges the community to remain vigilant and report any unfamiliar weed sites. **Biosecurity Communication**

### **Maintenance**

The rural road maintenance teams have been impacted by the rain events during January. However, the teams are now back on the ground and working through the backlog. The teams are working on flood damage roads. We have five teams on the ground, four teams comprise significant shire staff numbers supplemented with contract staff, the fifth team is entirely a contractor staffed team. The contractor team has been unfortunately washed out due to the rain and high river levels.

### Mosquitoes

The wet weather has arrived, and  $\mathfrak{T}$ unfortunately, so have the mosquitoes. Take action by ensuring there's no stagnant rainwater pooling in your yard, as this serves as ideal breeding grounds for mosquitoes. Regularly tip out and refill outdoor pet water bowls to deter mosquitoes from infesting your backyard.
