Council has finalised the 2024/2025 annual budget which will be adopted at a special meeting on Friday, 26 July. Recently I travelled with the Deputy Mayor and CEO to Canberra for the Outback Way Forum 2024. A diverse range of stakeholders involved in the Outback Highway were in attendance for discussion panels and workshops regarding the socio-economic benefits that upgrading this highway will provide for business, industry and communities across the centre of the nation. We also attended the (ALGA) Australian Local Government Association conference where 161 motions were debated over 3 days. This was a wonderful opportunity to network with fellow councillors Australia wide and discuss common issues at a local government level, while also hearing from politicians from both political parties in government. Congratulations to the Outback Writers Festival organisers for a wonderful week of writing workshops, book

launches, keynote speakers, panel discussions and dinners. Author, W. Benjamin Lindner launched his latest book "Winton's Waltzing Matilda Centre". I thoroughly enjoyed listening to Benjamin speak as he provided some interesting details, particularly regarding Christina McPherson and the role she played in converting Banjo Patterson's words into a song, and the many coincidences which commonly occurred on the 18th June.....you will just have to read the book!....

The Vision Splendid Outback Film Festival once again provided us with feast of films. This year, two plaques were placed in the "Walk of Fame" footpath outside the Royal Theatre. These recognise actress, Sigrid Thornton who delighted us with her presence and past Koa Elder and Vision Splendid board member, the late Mr Michael Mace who was instrumental in the festival's ongoing success. Council would also like to thank the Vision Splendid board for their recent contribution of new seating in the Sarah Riley Theatre at the Waltzing Matilda Centre.

Elderslie Street was transformed into a sea of Opal trading stalls during the QBOA Opal Festival on Friday 12 and Saturday 13 July. It was great to see representatives from the Department of Resources and DESI (Department of Environment and Science) travel to Winton to attend this festival.

Thanks to the Mayor Sally O'Neil from the Barcoo Shire who assisted me in introducing the representatives to opal buyers (most of whom were International), the local opal miners and local businesses. The representatives also enjoyed an opal cutting demonstration and a guided tour of Opalton. All parties benefited from their time in Winton and RAPAD will continue to work on solutions that will suit all stakeholders in this vital industry.

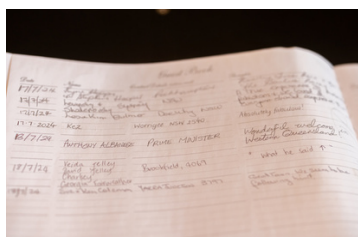

International Tourism expenditure in Queensland



It's official, Queensland's tourism industry has soared to new heights, surpassing pre-pandemic records according to the latest data from Tourism Research Australia.

In the year ending March 2024, Queensland welcomed 27 million visitors, injecting \$34.1 billion into the state's economy. Queensland's tourism industry remains strong, with increased Overnight Visitor Expenditure (OVE) and visitor numbers, OVE having a 100.9 per cent recovery compared to 2019.

The international market continued to grow strong with New Zealand, China, the United Kingdom, Japan and the United States of America being the five source markets for overnight visitor expenditure.

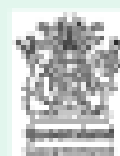
